**"A Place for the Young"**

Whilst in Tel Aviv just before Rosh Hashanah, we took a little time off from the usual inactivities and had a walk down Arlozorov Street, which is a road going inland just between the Hilton and Carlton Hotels.

We had actually been unable to attend the Dedication Ceremony a few days prior to our arrival in Israel, of the Mina and Everard Goodman Educational Campus, comprising 5 classrooms including a Computer Room and 3 WIZO Day Care Centres by the Minister of Education, Mayor of Tel Aviv, Rabbi Lau, Chief Rabi of Tel Aviv, and the Chairperson of the World WIZO Executive, but we were anxious to see what went on there.

The School only opened on the 1<sup>st</sup>, and was officially Dedicated on the 3<sup>rd</sup> September. Just past the Histadrut Headquarters there is a long very impressive building, white and bright in the strong sunlight, the carefully woven fencing softens the exterior, and at the door we saw several young parents, those who were entering were either alone or in couples but pushing the inevitable buggy, the type which one has to dodge in Brent Cross or other shopping centres, containing a selection of bright eyed, if somewhat apprehensive toddlers. Similar young parents were coming out of the doors, but this time striding purposefully towards other duties.

And here lay the clue to the purpose of the new Complex, so thoughtfully constructed by Mina and Everard Goodman over a two year period.

A clue corroborated by lines of kids buggies and push chairs all parked in a neat and disciplined way, they had to be, because they all looked alike.

The Building is a crèche, a school, a nursery for the young, call it what you will, but the purpose it serves is to allow parents, or in many cases a single parent, to go about getting their life together, be it to work, to study, to look after parents, to look after other children, but whilst doing this to have the peace of mind knowing that their children are in kind capable hands and being well looked after, including the necessary safety shelters for the three hundred babes and children there for their first introduction to learning.

They are looked after in a way which doesn't even breath a hint of institutionalisation, but instead evokes the freshly cooked smell of home.

And how is this done? well simply by having a large open kitchen manned by a group of large open, homely ladies cooking familiar and nourishing lunch for the kids.

We were shown round by the Headmistress, who seeing us hovering near the properly secured entrance, and upon hearing from whence we came, immediately provided a short conducted tour.

The upstairs area was a Bedlam of crying, crawling babes, crawling on soft carpets and with caring staff, or in some cases parents, anxious about that "first day at school", parents, whom we were told, were welcome to stay as long as little Gideon or Miriam felt safe in the company of his or her peers.

Downstairs, two large rooms, one for those who could walk, and one for those who could run, with a profusion of toys and playthings, and an outside garden to keep them occupied, but wherever you looked, a pair of kind guiding hands. Guiding children who could get on with growing up whilst their parents could get on with creating and maintaining the economy of the State of Israel.

The Campus is a great tribute to the generosity and foresight of Mina and Everard, and we congratulate them on what they have fulfilled.
