Princesses and Pesach

If things work out as I hope, we may soon have a Princess coming to our shul. Not a Jewish Princess, as you all know we have more than one of those every week. I mean a real live Princess. I have invited Princess Lalla Joumala Alaoue, who happens to be the Moroccan Ambassador, to visit an exhibition of paintings by Bettina Caro in the Bloomstein Hall.

Bettina is a very talented artist and you will shortly receive more details about her, but suffice it to say she was born in Morocco, as were some of our most distinguished members. Jews lived in Morocco for many centuries, 225,000 before the last war, but during the Vichy government and immediately after the end of the war there were disturbing times.

In 1963 over 100,000 left for Israel, but before his death in 1999 King Hassan protected the population and presently Morocco has one of the most tolerant environments for Jews in the Arab world. They visit Israel freely and hold positions in business and government. If she is able to be with us the Princess Lalla will be made most welcome.

However until then, let's got on with Pesach. If there is one aspect of Pesach that I just cannot get my head around it is the fact that there are times when I am going through the prayers which I went through only yesterday, and there are those who, on the ladder of piety are several rungs above me, yet they are going about their normal every day business. And what is the difference between us? Just over two thousand miles and an El Al ticket. But I still prefer to stay at home for Seder.

Don't get me wrong, its not just Pesach that I don't go away.

I like London in August, and also during those magic days between the December Bank Holiday and the January one. My Children were probably the only ones who never went away for half-term, and for the simple reason, as I would patiently explain to them, because every body else did. Pesach at home however is my tradition, tiring, exhausting, argumentative, but then, that's family for you. Well done Diana.
